	Incident overview		Dead tree discovered leaning against zipline rope after wind storm. Zipline was not operating at the time the tree fell
INVESTIGATION CONCLUSIONS	Site, system and components		<ul> <li>Zipline system approximately 1230 m in length.</li> <li>System has 2 zipline ropes that run parallel with each other over the 1230 m distance</li> <li>7/8" diameter wire rope.</li> </ul>
	Failure scenario(s)		Dead tree failed to remain upright during windstorm.
	Facts and evidence		<ul> <li>As per operating contractors report:</li> <li>A windstorm the previous day made it necessary for the operator to shut down operations in the early afternoon.</li> <li>During opening inspection the next day, a dead tree (cedar) approximately 8" diameter was found to be resting against one of the zipline rope (see photo)</li> <li>Tree was removed, equipment was assessed for damage (none found).</li> <li>The wind storm of December 20, 2018 was a significantly destructive storm causing much damage throughout the province of B.C.</li> <li>It is probable that winds were of a magnitude that the likely weakened dead tree fell.</li> </ul>
